Re : Consider establishing 45-mph speed limit on E 1500 Road north of US-24/40

This department received a request from Rich Bireta, Grant Township trustee, to conduct a speed study for E 1500 Road from US-24/40 highway north to N 2100 Road (Douglas/Jefferson county line). This portion of E 1500 Road is not currently posted for a maximum speed limit. This means the maximum speed limit is as "reasonable and prudent", but no greater than 55 mph.

Traffic counts and speed data were collected on November 11 & 12, 2009 at two locations on E 1500 Road. The two locations were (1) approximately ¼ mile north of US-24/40 highway, and (2) approximately ¼ mile north of N 1900 Road. At the first location, the 24-hour vehicle count was 483 vehicles and the 85th percentile speed was 45 mph. At the second location, measured 24-hour volume and 85th-percentile speed were 481 vehicles and 48 mph.

Based on the data collected, and a review of the road's geometry, condition and access points, it would be reasonable to post this three-mile section of E 1500 Road at 45 mph. Rich Bireta concurs that this is a reasonable speed limit.

Action Required: Consider approving the attached resolution, which establishes a 45-mph speed limit on E 1500 Road from US-24/40 highway north to N 2100 Road.

as set by K.S.A. 8-1558, is greater than is reasonable or safe under the conditions found to exist on the above described road under the jurisdiction of this Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DOUGLAS COUNTY, KANSAS that a speed limit of 45 miles per hour is hereby determined and declared to be a reasonable and safe speed limit for the above described road.

This speed limit shall become effective when appropriate signs giving notice thereof are erected upon the road above described.

Re : Consent Agenda authorization to renew pavement markings contract

This department contracts for supplying materials and painting pavement markings on county routes. Pavement markings typically need repainting annually. The BOCC executed a contract in 2007 for pavement marking services, and the contract is renewable for an additional four years (through 2011). Douglas County determines whether to renew the contract following the contractor's submittal of prices each year.

Our current contract is with Midwest Striping, Inc. from Grand Island, Nebraska. We have been extremely pleased with the quality of work and the responsiveness and cooperation from this contractor. This contractor provides excellent service at a reasonable cost. When we opened bids in 2007, we had two bidders. Midwest Striping was the low bid at \$117,573, and the only other bid was \$162,747.

Midwest Striping has submitted their prices for 2010 (see attached). The material cost for paint has increased \$0.47 per gallon. The application cost remains unchanged at \$4.25/gallon.

The total bid amount for 2010 pavement marking is \$131,576.43. Road & Bridge Fund 201 has \$134,490 allocated for this work.

I am also requesting authorization to approve change orders up to 5% of contract cost. The paint application rate will vary depending on pavement surface type. For example, the application rate will increase on newly chip sealed pavements. Typically, our final costs are very close to the bid amount.

Action Required: Consent Agenda authorization for the Public Works Director to renew the contract with Midwest Striping, Inc. for 2010 pavement markings in the amount of \$131,576.43, and authorization for Public Works Director to approve change orders totaling up to 5% over the contract amount.

to Route 460

In October 2008, I authorized the installation of temporary 40-mph speed limit signs on E 2300 Road between US-56 highway and Route 460. The Palmyra Township trustee at the time, Rex Hagerman, requested the speed limit. These speed limit signs have remained in place since that time.

We measured prevailing speeds at two locations in this five-mile road segment before and after installation of the signs. Prior to installation of the signs, 85th-percentile speeds were 44 mph and 43 mph. After installation of the signs, 85% speeds were 41 mph and 42 mph.

The current Palmyra Township trustee, Sandy Elliott, wishes for the signs to remain in place. In order to make the speed limit enforceable, the BOCC must pass a resolution establishing the speed limit.

Action Required: Consent Agenda approval of the attached resolution establishing a 40-mph speed limit on E 2300 Road from US-56 highway to Route 460.

Re : Consider establishing 35-mph speed limit on N 400 Road from Route 1061

to E 2400 Road

In October 2008, I authorized the installation of temporary 35-mph speed limit signs on E 400 Road between Route 1061 and E 2400 Road, or the Douglas/Johnson county line. The Palmyra Township trustee at the time, Rex Hagerman, requested the speed limit. These speed limit signs have remained in place since that time.

We measured prevailing speeds at two locations in this two-mile road segment before and after installation of the signs. Prior to installation of the signs, 85th-percentile speeds were 38 mph and 40 mph. After installation of the signs, 85% speeds were 39 mph and 42 mph.

Although the above 85% speeds indicate speeds increased slightly following installation of the 35-mph speed limit signs, the higher speeds could be attributed to weather and/or road conditions on that particular day. While 85% speeds seem to indicate 40-mph may be an appropriate speed limit, 35 mph is more appropriate given the road's geometry.

The current Palmyra Township trustee, Sandy Elliott, wishes for the 35-mph speed limit signs to remain in place. In order to make the speed limit enforceable, the BOCC must pass a resolution establishing the speed limit.

Action Required: Consent Agenda approval of the attached resolution establishing a 35-mph speed limit on N 400 Road from Route 1061 to E 2400 Road.

to US-56 highway

In November 2008, the Palmyra Township trustee, Rex Hagerman, expressed concern about traffic speeds on E 1900 Road between N 1 Road (Douglas/Franklin county line) and US-56 highway. We collected traffic speed and volume information in November 2008, summarized below.

Location	24-hour volume	85 th percentile speed	
N0049-E1900 NB	37 vpd	52 mph

At N0049-E1900 northbound, the highest speeds were between 61 and 65, and there were two vehicles traveling at that speed. At N0049-E1900 southbound, the highest speeds were between 56 and 60, and there were three vehicles traveling at that speed. At N0150-E1900 for both northbound and southbound, the highest speeds were between 56 and 60 and there was one vehicle traveling that speed in each direction.

Based on the 85th percentile speed information, the appropriate speed limit for this two-mile section of E 1900 Rd is 45 mph.

The current Palmyra Township trustee, Sandy Elliott, agrees a 45-mph speed limit is appropriate for this road segment. Upon approval of a resolution, Palmyra Township will install and maintain the speed limit signs.

Abutment modifications and deck repairs

Route 1023 bridges over Deer Creek and Dry Branch Deer Creek

Bridge Nos. 15.55N-02.50Eand 13.26N-02.50E

Bids were opened March 16, 2010 for the referenced project. The project involves bridge rehabilitation for two Route 1023 bridges located 0.45 miles and 2.74 miles south of Stull. The project includes removing both expansion joints for Bridge No. 15.55-02.50, and modifying the abutments so the steel girders are integral with the abutments. The project also includes milling the concrete deck for each bridge to 1-inch depth, patching any unsound concrete, placing a 1-1/2 inch silica fume concrete overlay for each bridge, and asphalt approach transitions for both bridges. The project will address failed expansion joints for the northernmost bridge, and delaminated concrete decks for both bridges.

This project is similar to last year's project for the Route 1023/458 bridges over the Wakarusa River arm and the Rock Creek arm of Clinton Lake. Both bridges will remain open to one-lane traffic. Temporary traffic signals will control traffic at each bridge. We anticipate beginning construction by May 1, and completing construction by mid-July.

A bid tabulation is attached showing the five bids received. All bids were substantially less than the engineer's estimate of \$341,341. We recommend accepting the low bid of \$263,331.25, and entering into a contract with King Construction Co., Inc. (Hesston, KS).

Please note the final cost will depend on the amount of concrete deck patching required. This will be determined following the milling of each deck. Plan quantities were derived from chain dragging both decks and marking delaminated areas, so these quantities should be reasonably accurate. However, we request authority to approve change orders totaling 5% of the contract amount.

Action Required: Consider awarding a construction contract for \$263,331.25 to the low bidder, King Construction Co, Inc., for Project No. 2010-5, the rehabilitation of Bridge Nos. 15.55N-02.50E and 13.26N-02.50E, and authorizing the Public Works Director to approve change orders totaling up to 5% of the contract amount.

Public Works Department requests approval to solicit bids for 3000 tons of highway de-icing salt for the 2010/2011 winter storm season. Under terms of the contract, 2000 tons would be delivered during 2010 and the remaining 1,000 tons would be delivered after January 1, 2011.

Road & Bridge Fund 201 has \$139,725 allocated in the Salt line item this year.

Bids will be solicited jointly for the City of Lawrence, City of Eudora, City of Ottawa, Wakarusa Township, Franklin County and Douglas County. Bids will be opened in the Douglas County Clerk's office in April and we will subsequently present a contract to the BOCC for approval.

RE: Solar Thermal Proposals

Solar Thermal Request for Proposal (RFP)

The Douglas County Commission, on December 16, 2009, approved a solar thermal system for the Douglas County Jail. County staff authored a Solar Thermal Request for Proposal (RFP) and received a total of four proposals from two contractors. The following is a summary of the proposals from the winning bidder, Solar Heat Exchange Manufacturing of Perry, KS.

Proposal #1, Douglas County Jail

The proposal for the Douglas County Jail would incorporate 5 Solene solar thermal collectors, each measuring 4 ft. x 10 ft., for a total of 200 sq. ft. of solar thermal collection. The purchase and installation price of this system is \$13,452.00. This includes a standard warranty (discussed below), as well as all installation and labor.

Douglas County is eligible, through a tax credit sale from the contractor, for a 30% federal tax credit, for purchasing and installing solar thermal power. The contractor has offered a five year lease of the solar thermal equipment, which would pass along 25% of the 30% federal tax credit, with an additional \$1,000 document review fee. This would bring the total capital cost to \$11,089; however, after the 5 years of interest is accrued the total purchase price for the County would be \$13,671.73, which is greater than the outright purchase price.

Proposal #2, Youth Services Building

The proposal for the Douglas County Youth Services building would incorporate 3 Solene solar thermal panels, each measuring 4 x 8 ft. for a total of 96 sq. ft. of solar thermal collection. The purchase and installation price is \$8,452. This includes a standard warranty, as well as all installation and labor.

The contractor has again offered a 5 year lease plan with a tax credit sale. The capital cost for this proposal is \$7,318; however, after the 5 years of interest is accrued the total purchase price would be \$9,022.43, which is greater than the outright purchase price.

Proposal #3, multiple installations

The combination of proposals would include the same parameters as above, however, the contractor is willing to discount the installation and purchase price of a combined installation project to \$19,998, from the sum of the two proposals listed above which is \$21,876. This would include a standard warranty, as well as installation and labor.

The lease price of the combination installation would be \$17,407.00 in principle, with a total 5 year purchase price of \$21,461.25, which is significantly greater than the outright purchase price.

Warranty Options

Below is the list of warranty options made available by Solar Heat Exchange Manufacturing. Both warranty options cover the system for any mechanical defect, material defect, installation defect, or natural failure within the expected lifetime of the system. The factory warranty covers the collectors and tanks against any defect for 10 years. The pump manufacturer's warranty is 18 months and the controller warranty is 2 years.

Warranty #1

Under the standard warranty any defect or malfunction will be fully covered for the first 18 months, after this period the contractor agrees to fix or replace all items within 3 business days for a charge of parts cost + 20% and \$80/hr. The total cost of this warranty will not exceed \$1,000 in the ten-year period of the warranty.

Warranty #2

Under the extended warranty, for \$1,000 dollars in initial additional cost, the contractor will replace or repair any and all non-warranty costs and parts including installation and labor at no additional charge.

Installation and guarantees

Installation will be scheduled within 30 days of the approval of the proposal. Installation will occur at the convenience of the appropriate authority within each facility. Prices in the proposal are guaranteed for 120 days from the closing date of the RFP, February 19, 2010.

Changes from presentation

The proposals received for this project are consistent with staff projections as presented to the County Commission in the areas of solar thermal production, installation and warranty costs, simple payback, net-present value, system size, scope of work, and warranty.

The significant changes in these proposals from the staff presentation to the Commission include:

- Installation location at the Douglas County Jail
- Additional installation location at Douglas County Youth Services

Staff presented installation to occur on the roof of the Douglas County Jail. Because of the discovery of potential roof damage, particularly the presence of trapped water and water damage, contractors refused to install solar thermal collectors on the roof. Please see the attached ICC Thermal Mapping & Surveying scan for more information on the possible roof deficiencies.

The proposal, as received by the County, calls for installation to occur on the grounds outside of the jail. The proposal acknowledges the system will be fixed, however, it could be moved to the roof of any new construction at a later date, with minimal cost to the County.

The RFP invited contractors to tour the Youth Services Building and make proposals as an alternative, or in conjunction with, the Douglas County Jail. In the staff presentation to the Commission alternative sites were mentioned, but were not explicitly discussed.

Payback


Payback will be achieved for the Douglas County Jail in 8 years. Payback will be achieved for the Youth Services Building in 10 years.

Payback for the combined proposal will occur between 8-9 years.

Recommendation

Staff recommends the County move forward with the standard warranty, option #1, and the combination installation, proposal #3. The discounted cost of \$19,998 and the payback projections are within the scope of the project as approved by the Douglas County Commission.

Under this recommendation the total cost for the solar thermal project, with installation at the Douglas County Jail and the Douglas County Youth Services building, will be \$19,998.00.

Public Works has funds allocated to replace radio equipment for the Operations Division. Their current system is being phased out. It is a stand-alone low band system using 1940 technology. The low band system has several problems associated with it, such as radio skip (interference), limited coverage, and internal interoperability problems.

In the past year the Operations Division has been testing four mobile and ten portable 800 MHZ radios that were replacements from the Sheriff's Office. This equipment has a higher performance level and allows communication with Emergency Communication, Emergency Management, Sheriff's Office, and in case of an emergency KDOT (Kansas Department of Transportation) and KHP (Kansas Highway Patrol). The long range plan is for the City of Lawrence to be on a similar system.

The State of Kansas has a contract established with Motorola for the purchase of radio equipment which can be accessed by political subdivisions. TFM Comm Inc. is the authorized Motorola dealer for this area and has provided a quote of \$153,334.64 for 40 mobile and 10 portable 800 MHZ radios with 4 control stations, labor, and programming.

Funds have been allocated in equipment reserve for this expenditure. Mike Perkins and I will be available at the meeting to answer any questions you may have.

RECOMMENDATION: The Board of County Commissioners approves accessing the State contract with Motorola in the amount of \$153,334.64 for the purchase of radio equipment.

First United Methodist Church, 867 Hwy 40

Please place this request on a County Commission agenda for consideration.

Background

On May 16, 2007, the County Commission approved a Conditional Use Permit for the operation of a Child Care Center (preschool) at First United Methodist Church (FUMC) located west of K-10 on Highway 40. As part of the review of the Child Care Center proposal, KDOT reviewed the submitted traffic impact analysis (TIS) and required that improvements including a west-bound left-turn lane be made to Highway 40. [This requirement was reflected in Condition No. 2 which stated: *'Submittal and approval of a Kansas Department of Transportation permit application that includes scaled plans with details of the area from the west ramp terminus of K-10 to 300 feet west of the site's temporary driveway.*]

Staff was asked to assist in facilitating the opening of the preschool in August 2007 and permitted the opening upon receipt of a letter from KDOT indicating the concept plan for improvements was acceptable. The applicant's engineer included the conceptual improvements to Highway 40 on the site plan that was approved and released as part of the CUP. The preschool has been operating each school year since August 2007.

Recent Discussions

April 2009

Staff received inquiries from FUMC regarding what outstanding expenses there
may be for future road improvements. Church representatives were exploring
options to not construct the improvements at this time since there is general

agreement that any improvements may likely be removed or altered in the future as additional development occurs along the corridor.

May 2009

 After following up with KDOT personnel, it was determined that final plans had not been provided by the applicant's consultant to KDOT for permitting and construction.

June 2009

The engineering consultant for FUMC submitted an addendum to the initial traffic impact study to KDOT for consideration to eliminate the previously required road improvements. The addendum analysis was based on actual traffic counts rather than the estimates used prior to the preschool operation.

September 2009

- Staff was notified that KDOT had determined that a dedicated left-turn lane at the church/preschool entrance would not be required at this time based on the applicant's revised TIS.
- The applicant's representative requested that Condition No. 2 be administratively removed following KDOT's determination.

October 2009

- Staff notified the applicant that the site plan should be revised and returned to the County Commission for re-approval without the public improvements shown.
- The applicant's representative indicated that they had elected to do nothing at this time, providing their opinion that Condition No. 2 was satisfied by submitting plans to KDOT.
- The Planning Director sent communication indicating that doing nothing places the CUP in violation since the CUP required the construction of the improvements for the benefit of the school use.

In Staff's opinion, the Board of County Commissioners should determine, with the input of KDOT, the County Engineer and the public, whether improvements are necessary. After discussion with Staff, the County Administrator suggested that the CUP be placed on a Commission agenda so that the condition regarding improvements to Highway 40 could be officially removed from the Conditional Use Permit approval, if determined to be appropriate.

Request

Consider re-approval of CUP-2-4-07 for a Child Care Center (preschool) at First United Methodist Church located at 867 Highway 40 subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Documentation of licensure of the child care center from the Kansas Department of Health and Environment. [completed]
- 2.—Submittal and approval of a Kansas Department of Transportation permit application that includes scaled plans with details of the area from the west ramp terminus of K-10 to 300 feet west of the site's temporary driveway.
- 3. Revision of the site plan to include the following:

- a. Revision of the child care center information to include the maximum numbers of classes, children, and teachers expected on each weekday. Information for the pre-school classes and parent's day out program should be included. [completed]
- b. Addition of a note, stating that if the numbers of children or classes is increased beyond the numbers noted on the plan, the Douglas County Zoning Codes Enforcement Officer will be contacted for further instruction. [completed]
- c. Addition of a note, stating that the subject CUP will expire on May 16, 2017, with an administrative review of the CUP by May 16, 2012. A new CUP application should be submitted and approved prior to May 16, 2017. [completed]
- 4. Provision of a revised site plan that indicates (either by deletion or note) that the previously shown improvements to Highway 40 will not be constructed.

Scott – We actually met on this matter in late August. I apologize for not passing this information on sooner – we had some things to square away internally. Upon further review, KDOT has decided not to require a dedicated left turn lane at the subject location. Our decision was based on the results of the TIS Addendum (May 2009) that considered existing traffic conditions, no significant accident history since the opening of the preschool, and uncertainty about proposed development in this area. Please note, this existing access is still to be considered as "temporary" until such time alternative access is established via John Wesley Drive. KDOT reserves the right to require the petitioner to make modifications to this access, including but not limited to, a dedicated WB left turn lane, should conditions change or they are otherwise warranted.

The applicant will need to contact our Area Office and withdraw the access permit request to develop a WB left turn lane. Contact information is below.

Regarding the development potential of parcels near the subject area, I would like to schedule a meeting with you and discuss the feasibility of KDOT, Douglas County, Lawrence, and the MPO participating in a US-40/K-10 Corridor Management Plan. At a glance, I'm thinking the study area would be from Stull Road to George Williams on US-40 and KTA to Clinton Parkway on K-10.
