



### A. SUMMARY

**SP-1-5-11:** Consider a Site Plan for a building addition at Building Blocks Daycare, located at 1411 E 1850 Rd. Submitted by Peter Shenouda, property owner of record.

### B. GENERAL INFORMATION

Current Zoning and Land Use: A (Agricultural) District; daycare facility.

Surrounding Zoning and Land Use: North: VC (Valley Channel) District; crop

agricultural uses

South: A District; rural residence

East: A District and VC District; agricultural land

uses and rural residences

West: VC District; crop agriculture

Site Summary:

Gross Area: 4.74 acres (20,6645.95 square feet)

Existing Building Coverage: 13,114 square feet Proposed Building Coverage: 1,530 square feet

### C. STAFF REVIEW

This site plan is a revision to the site plan for an existing Conditional Use Permit (CUP-9-7-03) for Building Blocks Daycare located at 1411 E 1850 Rd. This is located just east of Lawrence and the East Hills Business Park. This site was at one time the Kaw Valley School and more recently Bishop Seabury. The proposed change to the site plan is to attach two buildings with a hall/common space that includes storage and mechanical rooms, and restrooms. This addition will increase the existing permitted number of students from 100 students to 129 students. This change has been noted on the site plan. The applicant stated that the demand for infant thru preschool care has grown and in order to expand the service for this age group in the unattached building, KDHE is requiring the connection to provide access to amenities in the main facility and to provide additional restroom facilities.

As a condition of the approval of the CUP in 2003, the approval will expire in November 2013.

### D. Findings

Per Section 12-319A-5, staff shall first find that the following conditions have been met:

(a) That the proposed use is a permitted use in the district in which the property is located:

SP-1-5-11 Page 1

The subject property has a current CUP that permits the daycare use on this property.

(b) That the proposed arrangement of buildings, off-street parking, access, lighting, landscaping, and drainage is compatible with adjacent land uses;

The proposed building addition is between two existing buildings and will be compatible with the adjacent land use.

(c) That the vehicular ingress and egress to and from the site and circulation within the site provides for safe, efficient and convenient movement of traffic not only within the site but on adjacent roadways as well;

The vehicular circulation is adequate and not changing from the approved CUP.

(d) That the site plan provides for the safe movement of pedestrians within the site;

The site plan identifies existing sidewalks throughout the site that are adequate to meet the needs.

(e) That there is a sufficient mixture of grass, trees, and shrubs within the interior and perimeter (including public right-of-way) of site so that the proposed development will be in harmony with adjacent land uses and will provide a pleasing appearance to the public. Any part of the site plan area not used for buildings, structures, parking, or accessways shall be landscaped with a mixture of grass, trees and shrubs;

The site contains a large amount of greenspace and existing mature trees are along the south property line which is adjacent to a residential use.

(f) That all outdoor trash storage areas are screened;


No change in trash location is proposed.

### E. CONCLUSION



Subject: New Phone System for Douglas County Emergency Communications

The current phone system is over ten years old and is obsolete, very outdated, and costly to maintain. The level of customer service we have received from the current vendor is very poor. They have been very inattentive to the needs of our current phone system. The current equipment we have installed is no longer being made, and is very difficult to repair.

Attached is a bid from Commenco for a new phone system for the Douglas County Emergency Communications Center. Commenco has provided phone service to our back-up 911 Center, KU Public Safety, since 1999. By accepting the bid from Commenco, we will have redundancy between both centers. By accepting this bid from Commenco as a sole source, it will save KU Public Safety as well as Douglas County ECC \$38,139.77 by sharing the cost of the geo-diverse equipment and the point-to-point link between Douglas County ECC and KU Public Safety. The new system will also be next generation 911 (NG911) compliant. All 911 centers nationwide will be required to be next generation compliant by January 1, 2013. Commenco was able to honor the MARC (Mid-America Regional Counsel) price for Douglas County by extending the MARC price to Douglas County for this bid.

The bid for our new phone system is \$262,891.88, which includes the shared cost with KU Public Safety. This amount includes the first year maintenance which is included in the total price, as well as the maintenance cost for the second and third year. We could choose to purchase the maintenance year to year, and it would drop the total cost to \$188,674.86. After the system was accepted and the initial warranty expired, the second year maintenance would be \$17,598.66 and the third year would be \$18,478.59.

I have attached the proposed bid from Commenco. The bid includes the proposal on the new phone system, the shared point-to-point link with KU Public Safety (the cost is divided between the two agencies), as well as the shared geo-diverse resources. This cost is also shared between Douglas County ECC and KU Public Safety. The project summary is also attached which included the total cost with 3 years of premium maintenance.

Commenco also provided an overview of their business that I have attached as well.

The 911 advisory board is supportive of this system. The cost would be paid out of the 911 fee fund-equipment reserve account in our budget. There are sufficient funds in this line item to support this purchase.


Subject: Policy for Allocation of Economic Development Funds

**Recommendation:** Staff recommends County Commissioners approve the "Policy for Allocation of Economic Development Funds," which can be found attached to this memo.

**Overview:** As part of the 2011 Douglas County budget, commissioners allocated \$350,000 to be directed toward economic development initiatives. Attached to this memo is the formulated policy outlining the guidelines for the allocation of this money. Funds will be allocated on a rolling basis beginning January 1 and ending December 31 of each year.


Douglas County will work in cooperation with cities and other economic development organizations in order to advance the economic goals of the community. Priority will be given toward targeted industries as identified within Horizon 2020, and all projects must be able to demonstrate a positive impact to the community.

**Details:** In order to maximize the funds set aside for economic development, \$30,000 of the money will be set aside for the creation of a revolving loan fund in order to assist small businesses throughout the County, and \$20,000 will be designated towards job training and work force development initiatives. Details for the revolving loan fund and work force development initiatives will be coordinated by the Douglas County Management Intern in coordination with the Lawrence Chamber of Commerce and staff from other cities. The remaining \$300,000 will be allocated at the discretion of the Board of County Commissioners for economic development initiatives. While the policy has identified three funding categories, the allocation of money should remain flexible and monies from one priority may be shifted to other priorities following County Commission approval.

**Policy for the Allocation of Economic Development Funds**

### Introduction:

The purpose of this document is to establish the policy and procedures of the County for granting funds allocated for economic development initiatives. As part of the 2011 Douglas County budget, County Commissioners allocated \$350,000 to be granted for projects located within the County. The discretion of these funds will be determined by the sitting Board of County Commissioners and may be used for any project that is committed to anyone of the following objectives:

- Encourage existing industry to expand
- Assist new business start-ups
- Recruit new companies from out-of-state and internationally
- Encourage high technology and research-based businesses
- Encourage training and development of Douglas County employees
- Encourage the location and retention of businesses which are good "corporate citizens" that will add to the quality of life in Douglas County through their leadership and support of local civic and philanthropic organizations.

### **General Objective:**

It is the overarching goal that the \$350,000 allocated for economic development purposes will increase the share of the tax base coming from non-residential growth, provide a level of job growth in excess of population growth, and increase career opportunities by attracting high-skilled jobs in expanding industries.

Historically, economic development programs and incentives have resided with city governments within the County; however, in order to become more competitive and promote Douglas County and its cities as an attractive place to conduct business, the County has agreed to allocate \$350,000 towards projects that advance the goals and objectives outlined in this document.

Douglas County will work in cooperation with other cities and economic development organizations, like local chamber of commerce associations, in order achieve this goal. This partnership will enable the community to maximize its resources and to develop a consensus regarding the kind of economic development that best advances the interests of the entire community.

*Horizon 2020*, the comprehensive plan for Douglas County, specifies that businesses within the following industries should particularly be a focus of economic development efforts:

- Life Sciences/Research
- Information Technology
- Aviation and Aerospace
- Value-Added Agriculture
- Light Manufacturing and Distribution

While relocation of new companies from out-of-state typically generates the most publicity, it is the policy of the County to place a high priority on the retention and expansion of existing businesses.

### **Economic Development Incentives:**

The primary incentive associated with this policy is the allocation of the \$350,000 as determined by the Board of Douglas County Commissioners. This money will be allocated on a rolling basis beginning January 1 and ending December 31 of each year. Projects must be able to demonstrate a positive impact to the community and advance the economic goals of the County.

In order to maximize the funds set aside for economic development, \$30,000 of the money will be designated as a revolving loan fund in order to assist small businesses throughout the County. Funds from the revolving loan may be used to help finance a project's start-up costs, expansion, and or retention initiatives. Another \$20,000 will be designated towards job training and work force development initiatives. The remaining \$300,000 will be available to the County Commission for economic development projects, and will be allocated at their discretion.

While this policy has identified three funding categories, the allocation of money should remain flexible and monies from one priority may be shifted to other priorities following County Commission approval.
