The Natural & Cultural Heritage Task Force would like to sincerely thank the Douglas County Commissioners for their continued support conserving the natural and cultural heritage of Douglas County. When the Task Force came together last fall there was a lot of work in front of us; however, after seven months and hours of public meetings and study sessions, the Natural & Cultural Heritage Task Force feels it has accomplished all of the tasks that we set out to complete. Over the course of the seven months, the Task Force held a listening tour across Douglas County visiting five communities: Baldwin City, Clinton, Eudora, Lawrence and Lecompton. From those listening tours a Final Report was created outlining 13 recommendations to the County Commission. Most recently the Task Force has approved the draft by-laws of the Heritage Conservation Council and application forms for the Douglas County Natural & Cultural Heritage Grant Program.

Heritage Conservation Council By-laws

May 4, 2011

Purpose

The purpose of the Heritage Conservation Council will be to fulfill the duties required to be designated a Certified Local Government. In addition to those duties the Heritage Conservation Council will be responsible for administering the Douglas County Natural and Cultural Heritage Grant Program and ensure the protection of Douglas County's natural and cultural resources.

Composition

The Douglas County Heritage Conservation Council shall consist of (7) seven members who are Douglas County residents, and who demonstrate an interest in historic preservation and conservation of the County's natural and cultural heritage. Every effort should be made to balance the representation of all communities and unincorporated areas in the County. All members will be appointed and approved by the Douglas County Commission. Three (3) members shall be a diversity of preservation-related professionals, as recognized by the relevant standards of their respective profession, such as architect, architectural historian, archeologist, historian, landscape architect, and planner. The remaining (4) four members shall be a diversity of either professionals or lay persons with interest in fields closely related to agriculture, tourism, unique and significant lands, ecology, geography, natural science, economic development, history, or environment. At least (1) one preservation professional shall be on each subcommittee.

Terms

The term of office of the members of the Council shall be for three (3) years, excepting the first Council which shall consist of two (2) members serving for one (1) year, two (2) members serving for two (2) years, and three (3) members serving for three (3) years. A member may not serve more than two (2) full consecutive terms. Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term only.

Officers

Officers shall consist of a Chair and Vice-Chair elected by the Council who shall each serve a term of one (1) year and shall be eligible for re-election; but no member shall serve as Chair for more than two (2) consecutive years. The Chair shall preside over meetings. In the absence of the Chair, the Vice-Chair shall perform the duties of the Chair. If both are absent, a Temporary Chair shall be elected by those present.

Meetings

(A) A quorum shall consist of a majority of the members. Decisions or actions of the Council shall be made using the consensus decision making rule, or by a majority vote if consensus cannot be reached. Meetings shall be held at the discretion of the Council at, with at least two of the meetings the beginning of each calendar year; additional meetings shall be on the call of the Chair. No member of the Council shall vote on any matter that may materially or apparently affect the property, income, or business interest of that member. No member of the Council may vote by proxy. No action shall be taken by the Council that could in any manner deprive or

restrict the owner of a property in its use, modification, maintenance, disposition, or demolition until such owner shall first have had the opportunity to be heard at a public meeting of the Council, as provided in this document. Final decisions regarding property will be made by the County Commission. The Chair, and in his or her absence the Acting Chair, may request the attendance of witnesses.

(B) All meetings of the Heritage Conservation Council shall be open to the public. The Council shall keep records of its examinations and other official actions, all of which shall be immediately filed in the office of the Council and shall be a public record.

POWERS & DUTIES

- **(A)** All of the powers and duties enumerated herein are subject to the approval, denial, or modification by the County Commission. All decisions made by the County Commission are subject to appeal to the District Court, pursuant to K.S.A. 60-2101. Further, all funds necessary to carry out the purpose of this document shall be approved and appropriated only by the County Commission.
- **(B)** In addition to other responsibilities specified in this document, the Heritage Conservation Council may:
 - (1) Adopt its own procedural regulations, subject to the laws of the State of Kansas and Douglas County;
 - (2) Conduct an ongoing inventory of natural and cultural heritage resources, including but not limited to historically and architecturally significant properties and lands, structures, and areas that exemplify the cultural, social, economic, political, agricultural, environmental, or architectural history of the nation, region, state, or county;
 - (3) Administer and preside over all aspects of the Natural & Cultural Heritage Grant Program. This includes evaluating and recommending to the County Commission which projects shall receive funding.
 - **(4)** Investigate and recommend to the County Commission the adoption of County resolutions designating sites, structures, lands, and objects having special historical, natural, community, or architectural value as landmarks;
 - **(5)** Investigate and recommend to the County Commission the adoption of resolutions designating areas having special historic, community, agricultural, natural, or architectural value as heritage districts;
 - **(6)** Keep a register of all properties, lands, and structures that have been designated as landmarks, heritage districts, or significant lands, including all information required for each designation;

- (7) Determine an appropriate system of markers and make recommendations for the design and implementation of specific markings of the streets and routes leading from one landmark or heritage district to another;
- (8) Advise and assist owners of properties or structures within the County on physical and financial aspects of preservation, renovation, rehabilitation, and reuse, and on procedures for inclusion on the Kansas and National Registers of Historic Places;
- **(9)** Initiate the nomination of landmarks and heritage districts to the Kansas and National Registers of Historic Places, and review and comment on any Kansas and National Register nominations submitted to the Council upon request of the County Commission;
- (10) Inform and educate the citizens of the County concerning the historic, natural, and architectural heritage of the County by producing maps, newsletters, brochures, pamphlets, books, and/or other appropriate materials, and hold public programs at least twice a year available, and free of charge, to the general public;
- (11) Hold public hearings and review applications for construction, alteration, removal, or demolition affecting proposed or designated landmarks or structures within heritage districts or their environs and issue or deny certificates of appropriateness or economic hardship for such actions. Applicants may be requested to submit plans, drawings, elevations, specifications, and other information as may be necessary to make decisions;
- (13) Review and comment upon proposed zoning amendments, applications for special use permits, or applications for zoning variances that affect proposed or designated landmarks and heritage districts. The Director of Planning shall cause copies of all applications for zoning amendments, and variances for sites designated as landmarks or within the area of a designated heritage district, or the environs thereof, to be sent to the Council no less than ten (10) days prior to the date of the hearing by the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission or the Board of Zoning Appeals;
- (14) Administer on behalf of the County any full or partial property interest in real property, including easements, that the County may have or accept as a gift or otherwise, upon authorization and approval of such administration by the County Commission;
- (15) Seek, accept, and administer on behalf of the County such gifts, grants, and money as may be appropriate for the purposes of this document. Such money may be expended for publishing maps and brochures or for hiring a staff person(s) or consultants or performing other appropriate functions for the purpose of carrying out the duties and powers of the Council and the purposes of this document;

- (16) Call upon available County staff members, citizens and other experts for technical advice;
- (17) Recommend retaining such specialists or consultants or recommend the appointment of such ad hoc citizen advisory committees as may be required from time to time;
- (18) Testify before all boards and commissions, including the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission and Board of Zoning Appeals, on any matter affecting historic, natural, and architecturally significant property, structures, and areas;
- (19) Confer recognition upon the owners of landmarks, property or structures within heritage districts by means of certificates, plaques or markers;
- **(20)** Periodically review the County's Zoning Code and recommend to the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission and the County Commission any amendments appropriate for the protection and continued use of landmarks or property and structures within heritage districts;
- **(21)** Attend a heritage preservation-related workshop each year with the aid of County funds, if available;
- (22) Review this document at least every five (5) years and make a report containing the following:
 - (A) An assessment of progress in preserving the architecturally, historically, and naturally important resources of the County;
 - **(B)** An analysis of numbers, types, locations, and dispositions of applications for designation and certificates of appropriateness, appeals, and variances as provided for in this document;
 - **(C)** An assessment of the progress and performance in educating the citizenry about the value of heritage preservation;
 - (D) An analysis of the validity of these regulations;
 - **(E)** Any recommended changes.
- (23) Undertake any other action or activity necessary or appropriate to the implementation of its powers and duties or implementation of the purpose of this document.

Funds have been allocated to purchase two SUV's for Zoning & Codes. They currently have two Ford F-150 pickup trucks with approximately 200,000 miles on each of them. Both trucks have been experiencing mechanical issues. After reviewing their options, staff believes a small SUV would best suit their needs. The two trucks will be sold in auction.

Both vehicles will be used by inspectors for the primary purpose of monitoring construction sites and zoning violation, along with other activities they are responsible for.

The deadline to order a 2011 Ford Escape has passed but the awarded dealership, Shawnee Mission Ford, on the regional cooperative bid has offered 2012 models at the 2011 prices. As you are aware, we participated in the 2011 cooperative bid through Mid-America Council of Public Purchasing. Below identifies the cost from Shawnee Mission Ford:

2010-2011 EXPERIENCE

Our comprehensive experience in claims for the 2010-2011 plan year has seen some increases. Through 9 months (2/28/2011) of the current period compared to the prior 12- month period, medical claims are 11.2% higher per employee per month (PEPM), an increase from \$505 to \$561. This increase is primarily due to several large claimants this year. Dental claims through 2/28 of the current period compared to the prior 12-month period are up 7.6%, an increase from \$45 to \$47. Pharmaceutical claims, during the same period, are down 3.6% PEPM, a decrease from \$148 to \$142. Overall, the total plan claims have increased 7.6% during this same period from \$697 to \$761. These amounts include any reimbursements from stop loss coverage.

Douglas county has 11 high dollar claimants (\$25K and over) represent 44% of total claims. During the previous plan year, there were 12 claimants representing 19% of total claims. The claims in the current period reached significantly higher levels. We experienced 3 claimants who exceeded the stop loss deductable with total reimbursements of \$288,000. Currently, stop loss coverage is activated when a claim exceeds \$175,000. In the prior year, there were no claims that exceeded the stop loss deductable of \$150,000.

FIXED COSTS FOR 2011-2012 PLAN YEAR

Each year, requests for proposals for reinsurance coverage are solicited from various companies. These responses have been narrowed to the two best quotations. We are recommending that the stop loss specific remain at \$175,000, with a continued \$50,000 aggregate specific. As we have learned from this past year's experience, this is the most cost effective level for us at this time.

As part of the process, when quoting their reinsurance, we are provided with the company's best guess of our expected claims cost and expand their aggregate claims at 125% of the expected claims. The table below outlines expected monthly and annual claims.

When deciding to switch stop loss providers, a number of factors need to be considered. Douglas County has been with ING for a number of years, and we have an excellent relationship with the company. Switching stop loss providers can be done, but does create a burden on staff. In addition, I had several concerns throughout this bid process. Final quotes from Optum were not submitted in a timely fashion, and their decision to add a laser liability on one current claim is concerning. A laser liability is when the stop loss provider decides, during the renewal/bid, process that they will not cover a current large claim. The responsibility for that claim would rest with the County. While this practice does occur in the industry, it creates a cost for us and may indicate problems with coverage in the future. Furthermore, given the size of our plan, this increase in fixed costs does not significantly alter estimated premium equivalents. Therefore, it is my recommendation to accept the stop loss/ reinsurance proposal from ING.

PHARMACEUTICAL PLAN FOR 2011-2011

Prescription drug claims are averaging \$86,469 per month (\$141 PEPM) on a rolling 12-month basis, essentially flat compared to the prior plan year. Medtrak continues to be our pharmacy benefits manager at the same rate we originally contracted, rates remain the same. The features we have incorporated have been beneficial to the plan as well as the participants.

- ✓ **Starter Dose with a 180-day look back**: individuals who present a <u>new</u> prescription for a maintenance prescription can only obtain a 30 day supply for the first fill. This saves the individual as well as the plan money should there be an issue with the prescription. After the first fill, the individual can refill the prescription for 90 days each fill. To determine if this is a new prescription, Medrak will look back 180 days at the individual's prescription history.
- ✓ **Step Therapy:** Medications in the categories of Alpha 1 blockers, Anti-Hypertensives, Lipid Lowering, Nasal Steroids, Proton- pump inhibitors, Muscle Relaxants, SSRI anti-depressants, Sedatives and Hypnotics and Triptans. Individuals who take maintenance drugs as described above are expected to start with the generic rather than the more costly name brand drug. Should the generic not achieve the desired result, then the brand name drug will be allowed.

✓ **WellTrak:** This chronic drug therapy program is designed to give participants to keep in touch with a clinical pharmacist assuring that they are getting the most out of their medications. Individuals who take several medications will be targeted. Those who sign up for this program will have opportunity to speak with a pharmacist who will review their medications – prescribed and over the counter and make suggestions. Each participant will receive 4 phone calls a year; a time when participants can ask questions and make up dates to their regimen. Those who meet the requirements of this plan, stay an active member will receive their generic medications at no cost and name brand drugs and half cost – providing those medications are treating those identified conditions. The fixed cost of the program is \$4.00 per member per month or \$40,000 per year.

PLAN CHANGES for 2011-2012

- ✓ <u>Required</u> plan year changes mandated by the Patient Protection and Affordability Care Act are as follows:
 - o There is no Lifetime Benefit Maximum.
 - Adding dependents up to age 26 that do not have medical coverage available to them at their place of business.
- ✓ Optional plan change
 - Plan coverage for domestic partners and dependents of domestic partners

PREMIUM LEVELS FOR 2011-2012

Willis staff with actuarial experience has reviewed our historical rolling 12-month claims and fixed costs in order to recommend premium levels for 2011-2012. As a result of this study, Willis recommends that our premiums levels increase 2.31%. Because Douglas County has opted to be a "grandfathered" plan, increases cannot be above 5% of the rate the previous year or risk being removed from that group, which would create other costly changes for the plan.


