Weeds on KDOT Right-of-Way

Attached is a proposed agreement between Douglas County and KDOT for the treatment of noxious weeds on state road rights-of-way in 2012. Under terms of the agreement, Douglas County treats noxious weeds and invoices KDOT for the wholesale cost of chemicals, plus labor and equipment hourly costs as shown in the agreement.

This department treated noxious weeds on state rights-of-way during 2011 under a similar agreement. We took into account treatment of noxious weeds on state rights-of-way during preparation and approval of the 2012 Noxious Weed budget within the General Fund.

Action Required: Consent Agenda approval of agreement with KDOT for the treatment of noxious weeds on state rights-of-way in 2012. The BOCC chair should sign the agreement.

This agreement shall terminate December 31st of this year, except records shall be maintained in accordance with Section Six above. Termination may be sooner by a ten day written notice from either party to the other. It is agreed further that this contract can be renewed for three consecutive years at the option of the Secretary upon a 30-day written notice to the contractor prior to December 31st of the current year. The contractor and the Secretary agree that all terms of the renewal will remain the same unless either party determines that the price of the chemicals should be re-negotiated. This agreement is officially adopted by the Board of County Commissioners and recorded in the official records of the proceedings of said Board. 




Construction is planned for late November and will be accomplished using county personnel.



2011 CAR CAMERA PURCHASE

I request that a purchase of seven Digital Ally DVM750 digital video mirror kits and accessories be added to the Douglas County Commission's consent agenda. This transaction will be made with Digital Ally and is expected to cost \$31,220.00. The funding for this purchase is currently available in the Douglas County Sheriff's Office budget.

Our current in-car digital video camera inventory is entirely composed of the digital video mirror kits manufactured by Digital Ally. Our current video management software only functions with this particular make of camera. Digital Ally has provided a very reliable product and excellent service. They are also the manufacturer and only distributor. In order to retain the level of quality, consistency, and compatibility for our equipment, this purchase qualifies as sole source.

The Patrol Division currently has fourteen in-car camera systems. Per the purchase memorandum and approval by the County Commission last year, half of these systems were upgraded at the end of 2010 with the stated intention of replacing the other half this year. The remaining seven cameras are approximately 5 years old and nearing the end of their life cycle. We would like to replace these cameras at this time.

This purchase has not been previously approved by the Board of County Commissioners, but the funding is currently available in the 2011 Sheriff's Office budget. This purchase is necessary to ensure the continued reliable operation of our vehicles assigned to the Patrol Division.

I recommend and request that the Board of County Commissioners waive the bidding process for this purchase based on its sole source status and authorize me to complete this purchase.

RE: Grant Recommendations for the Natural and Cultural Heritage Grant Program

The Heritage Conservation Council is recommending that 10 heritage conservation projects be funded in the 2011 round of grant awards. Under this recommendation, applicants would receive \$297,500.

The Commission created the Heritage Conservation Council to oversee heritage conservation efforts in Douglas County, including the Natural and Cultural Heritage Grant Program. The purpose of the program is to fund heritage projects aimed at conserving the rich natural and cultural heritage of Douglas County.

Of the \$350,000 approved for heritage conservation, \$297,500 for grants has been made available under program guidelines for 2011. Applicants sought nearly \$940,000 for 18 projects.

Upon receipt of the applications in late September, Council members read, reviewed, and systematically evaluated all eighteen applications. On October 20, three major grant applicants made presentations about their projects in person to the Council. Then on October 27 and November 3, the Council met to make their recommendations. As directed by the resolution that created the Council, all decisions were made using the consensus decision making model through facilitated discussions. The level of consensus on the Council for its recommendations was, and is, very high. All meetings of the Council were open to the public.

The Heritage Conservation Council is recommending that ten projects be funded. Two major projects would receive \$192,500, one fully funded and one partially. Eight target projects would receive \$105,000 with a mixture of full and partial funding.

The Heritage Conservation Council believes that its recommendations will truly further the conservation of our natural and cultural heritage in Douglas County. The Council asks for the consideration and support of the Douglas County Commission for the Council's grant recommendations.

I. MAJOR GRANTS

1. Applicant: Black Jack Battlefield Trust

• Project Title: Robert Hall Pearson Farmhouse Rehabilitation

Requested Amount: \$163,000Award Amount: \$163,000

Project Description Summary:

"This project is designed to document the history, architecture, and condition of the Robert Hall Pearson House and to restore the 1890 modest National Folk style farmhouse to its original appearance, to preserve it by preventing its deterioration due to the elements and to pest and rodent infestations, and to ensure its structural stability by repairing/replacing termite-damaged structural components. The project includes commissioning preservation specialists to prepare a Historic Structures Report, and based on the prioritized recommendations included in that report, restoration will proceed. Rehabilitation work is expected to include repointing the foundation and the chimney, repairing/replacing termite-damaged components, installing steps to the basement, removing 1970s addition, replacing missing windows, making windows operable, installing a heat source, replacing deteriorated flooring, and repairing/replacing damaged and missing plaster. Rehabilitation of the house will be prioritized based on the recommendations and up-to-date repair cost estimates included in the Historic Structures Report.

Also included in this project is the production of a video which will allow for compliance with ADA requirements for accessibility. The video is intended to provide visual access to the house in lieu of interior alterations which will compromise the historic character and interpretation of the house."

<u>Council supports full funding</u> for project as outlined in grant application and supported by the Historic Structures Report.

2. Applicant: Eudora Area Historical Society

Project Title: Renovation of 720 and 722 Main Street and Development of

Eudora Community Museum

Requested Amount: \$180,000Award Amount: \$29,500

• Project Description Summary:

"The historic buildings at 720 and 722 Main Street will be partly renovated to house the Eudora Community Museum and Eudora Area Historical Society."

To assist the applicant in moving forward, the <u>Council supports partial funding</u> to determine history of the structures and eligibility for the state register. Funding is also provided to hire an architect to formalize building utilization plans, assess conservation needs and prepare a historic structures rehabilitation plan.

II. TARGET GRANTS (Alphabetical Order)

1. Applicant: Clearfield Community Historical Society

Project Title: With Restoration on Interior and Exterior, make Clearfield

School a Heritage Visitor's Stop

Requested Amount: \$23,280Award Amount: \$3,000

Project Description Summary:

"Repair exterior walls and foundation. Remove honey bees and tree limbs too close to building. Restore electricity to the building. Make rudimentary meeting hall for community gatherings."

To assist the applicant in moving forward, Council supports partial funding to provide roof repair.

2. Applicant: Clinton Lake Historical Society

Project Title: Museum Addition to Wakarusa River Valley Heritage Museum

Requested Amount: \$79,809.17Award Amount: \$20,000

Project Description Summary:

"The present Wakarusa River Valley Heritage Museum is located in a *Ten Cow Barn (milk shed)* on the historical Colonel J.C. Steele property. The Museum collection is expansive, displaying the cultural and agricultural history of the Wakarusa Valley. Presently, storage of the collection is very limited and the need for an addition to the Museum is necessary."

To assist the applicant in moving forward, the <u>Council supports partial funding</u> to hire a museum consultant to prepare a collection management report and interpretative plan for the museum.

3. Applicant: Douglas County Master Gardeners

• Project Title: Heritage Trees of Douglas County, Kansas

Requested Amount: \$2,700Award Amount: \$2,700

Project Description Summary:

"Heritage Trees of Douglas County is a project to educate Douglas County residents and visitors about the cultural heritage of significant and historical trees, and to protect and conserve those trees."

Council fully supports project as outlined in grant application.

4. Applicant: Eudora Area Historical Society

Project Title: Signage for Historic Buildings on Main Street

Requested Amount: \$3,000Award Amount: \$3,000

Project Description Summary:

"Ten of the most historic buildings along Main Street in Eudora, with consent of the property owner, will have signs created detailing the history of that building and placed on the front for public viewing."

<u>Council fully supports</u> project as outlined in grant application.

5. Applicant: Kansas Land Trust, Inc.

Project Title: Hamilton Conservation Easement

Requested Amount: \$32,818Award Amount: \$22,300

Project Description Summary:

"Lois Hamilton will donate a 276-acre conservation easement to the Kansas Land Trust to protect as prime farmland into perpetuity approximately 200 acres of class II soils, additional farmland, and a wooded River riparian buffer."

<u>Council supports partial funding</u> to cover the Conservation Easement Due Diligence and Closing Costs and partial funding for the KLT Stewardship Fund Costs.

6. Applicant: Lawrence Preservation Alliance

• Project Title: Protecting Cultural Heritage through Listing on the National

Register of Historic Places

Requested Amount: \$10,000Award Amount: \$9,000

• Project Description Summary:

"We seek to protect cultural resources by working with partners to add three important properties to the National Register and/or conduct extensive historical research to increase our understanding of the significance of all three properties. If funded, we will also create and present public education programs on the benefits and process of such Registration to further the impact of this project."

<u>Council supports</u> project as outlined in grant application for national register nominations for B'nai Israel Cemetery, Robinson Oakridge Farm Barn, and 707 Main Street, Eudora, KS.

7. Applicant: Lecompton Historical Society

• Project Title: Relocation of 1892 Lecompton City Jail

Requested Amount: \$58,400Award Amount: \$15,000

Project Description Summary:

"Relocation of 1892 Lecompton City Jail from private property, owned by Tom and Carla Myer, 314 Isacks Street, Lecompton, Kansas, approximately 50 yards, across the alley to property owned by the Lecompton Historical Society which is adjacent to Constitution Hall, a National Landmark and Kansas State Historical Site."

Council supports partial funding to explore options to preserve the Lecompton City Jail without moving the structure as outlined in the application. Funds are provided to 1) enter into a one year contract with the property owner on which the jail sits to not demolish the jail 2) explore possibilities for permanent access to the building, including a permanent easement, and 3) make any repairs to keep the jail from deteriorating further while the above options are explored. Funding is not to be used for relocation.
