Flory called the regular meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, December 14, 2011 with all members present.

Motion was seconded by Thellman and carried 3-0.

REDISTRICTING COMMISSION BOUNDARIES 12-14-11

The Board discussed the process for redistricting the Douglas County Commission boundaries based on 2010 Census data. Flory said that the first proposal was his preference because it involved moving only two precincts from District 3 to District 1.

Gaughan felt there was need to have a full public hearing on this item.

It was the consensus of the Board to defer the item to the January 11, 2012 agenda to allow for a public hearing.

HERITAGE GRANTS 12-14-11

Commissioner Flory asked the Board for a discussion on the process for awarding the Heritage Grants.

Flory opened a discussion on the distribution of funds for the Wakarusa Museum. Flory stated he finds it troubling that the applicants were not present at the council discussions. The applicant didn't have an opportunity to respond to a significant change in what the council was recommending the funds for. He asked the Commission to lift the restrictions on \$20,000 to be applied to the building fund to start the process.

Jeanette Blackmar, Coordinator for the Heritage Grant fund, stated the council went by the applications only and that it was up to the grantee to make a case. Money was awarded to proceed to the next step of furthering future funding which is to secure an architect.

Gaughan commented that the awards were distributed in a way to make the applicants eligible for additional funding. Blackmar agreed that the vision of the council was empowering the applicant to find additional funding from other institutions beside Douglas County.

Thellman said she wants the museum to flourish and understands what the people out there want is to create a museum. The awarded amount shows the ability to partner for these bigger projects. This is an instance where the partnership is coming through. Eudora has a similar situation and realized their award became a good first step. In order to make peace and to get past this conflicted situation Thellman stated she is willing to ask the applicant to receive the award and for the counsel to take away the restriction of the architect and put the money towards the building fund.

Thellman moved to award \$20,000 in the form of a Heritage Grant toward the Wakarusa Museum building expansion. Motion was seconded by Flory and carried 3-0.

On a second discussion, Flory stated he thought the Board would have input into the Performance Agreement. He feels the contracts are too "federal grantish." Flory asked the Board to reconsider simplifying some of the language in the agreements.

It was the consensus of Board for Staff to come up with a revised contract for the awarded grant money and to bring the contract back to the Board for review.

Flory called the regular meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, January 4, 2012 with all members present.

CONSENT AGENDA 01-04-12

Flory moved approval of the following Consent Agenda:

- ► Commission Order No. 12-001(on file in the office of the Clerk); and
- ▶ Approval and authorization for the Public Works Director to sign a contract in the amount of \$9,461.00 with Kansas Gas Service for relocation of a gas line that conflicts with Project No. 2010-20, the reconstruction of Route 1055 (6th Street) from US-56 highway to Route 12 in Baldwin City.

Motion was seconded by Gaughan and carried 3-0.

2012 WORK PROGRAM 01-04-12

Scott McCullough, Lawrence-Douglas County Metropolitan Planning Director, made a presentation to the Board on the status of the 2011 projects completed and still in progress; and long-range planning for 2012.

Gaughan asked the status of the ongoing discussion for new industrial zoning categories. McCullough stated meetings have been scheduled for the Planning Commission to hear the revised text amendment. They are looking at creating a district between IL and IG, an Industrial Medium district that doesn't have the intense industrial uses of IG and commercial of IL.

Gaughan moved to approve the 2012 Work Plan. Motion was seconded by Thellman and carried 3-0.

PLANNING 01-04-12

The Board considered **CUP-10-5-11**, a Conditional Use Permit for Good Earth Gatherings, a recreation facility to provide community outreach, education, and ancillary retail sales on approximately 10.5 acres, located at 858 E 1500 Road. The application was submitted by Tamara Fairbanks-Ishmael, property owner of record. The item was approved by the Planning Commission on a 9-0 vote with conditions on December 12, 2011. Sandra Day, Lawrence-Douglas County Metropolitan Planning Staff, will present the item.

Staff findings are as follows:

- Zoning and uses of property nearby. The area is rural and zoned A
 (agricultural). Surrounding uses are predominantly residential. The
 proposed request will not alter the base zoning or land use of the area.
- II. Character of the area. The defining characteristic of the area is rural residential homes located along the County roads. The proposed use is consistent with the rural character of the area.
- III. Suitability of subject property for the uses to which it has been restricted. The property is suitable for a residential use with a home occupation that includes a limited retail element. The overall space dedicated to retails sales is clearly subordinate and accessory to the home occupation activity. The proposed retail use as a Conditional Use is suitable for this property.
- IV. Length of time subject property has remained vacant as zoned. The subject property is developed as a residential use. The County Zoning Regulations were adopted in 1966.
- V. Extent to which removal of restrictions will detrimentally affect nearby property. The significant concern generated by this request is the potential for trespass to private property and clarification in the application and operation of the use involving the lake. The addition of conditions that prohibit the use as part of the home occupation will ensure that detrimental effects are circumvented. The proposed use as described in the applicant's Business. Profile does not propose detrimental impacts to the surrounding area.
- VI. Relative gain to the public health, safety and welfare by the destruction of the value of the petitioner's property as compared to the hardship imposed upon the individual landowners. Approval of this request does not directly harm the public health, safety and welfare. Denial of the request limits the scope of the business for this site.
- VII. Conformance with the comprehensive plan. A conditional use permit can be used to allow specific uses that are not permitted in a zoning district with the approval of a site plan. This tool allows development to occur in harmony with the surrounding area and to address specific land use concerns.

There was discussion that a concerned neighbor questioned the expansion of the classes and setting limits on the number of classes that could be held. Flory suggested adding a condition that set a limit to the number of activities or days for activities.

Flory opened the item for public comment. No comment was received.

Flory moved to approve CUP-10-5-11 for Good Earth Gatherings recreation facility with the following conditions:

- 1. Provision of a revised site plan to include the following notes
- 2. Use of the lake for public, business, commercial, and recreation activities associated with the home occupation is prohibited.
- 3. Class size shall be limited to not more than 12 students and 1 instructor.
- 4. No more than one class shall be conducted/offered at a time.

And an additional condition limiting activities to 15 classes per month and six open business days to the permit. Motion was seconded by Gaughan and carried 3-0.

PLANNING 01-14-12

The Board considered approval of Text Amendments, **TA-3-3-10**, to the joint city/county subdivision regulations in the City of Lawrence Land Development Code, Chapter 20, Article 8 and the Douglas County Code, Chapter 11, Article 1 to revise process requirements for division of property through Certificates of Survey, Minor Subdivisions and Major Subdivisions. Modifications include reformatting this article/chapter to eliminate duplicative text and to delete terminology not used. Initiated by City Commission on 2/16/10. Re-initiated by Planning Commission on 5/23/11. Deferred by Planning Commission on 10/26/11. Adopt Joint City Ordinance No. 8690/County Resolution 12-01 for Text Amendments (TA-3-3-10) to the joint city/county subdivision regulations in the City of Lawrence Land Development Code, Chapter 20, Article 8 and the Douglas County Code, Chapter 11, Article 1 to revise process requirements for division of property through Certificates of Survey, Minor Subdivisions and Major Subdivisions. The item was approved by the Planning Commission with an 8-0-1 vote on December 12, 2011. Sheila Stogsdill, Lawrence-Douglas County Metropolitan Planning Commission, presented the item.

Flory opened the item for public comment. No comment was received.

Flory moved to adopt Joint Ordinance No. 8690 of the City of Lawrence /County Resolution No. 12-01 of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, amending Chapter 20, Article 8 of the Code of the City of Lawrence, Kansas, 2012 Edition, and amendments thereto, and Chapter 11, Article 1 of the Code of Douglas County, Kansas, and amendments thereto, pertaining to subdivision regulations, by adopting and incorporating by reference "Subdivision Regulations for Lawrence and Unincorporated areas of Douglas County, Kansas, January 10, 2012, Editions," and repealing the existing articles and sections. Motion was seconded by Thellman and carried 3-0.

Flory called the regular meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, January 11, 2012 with all members present.

CONSENT AGENDA 01-11-12

Flory moved approval of the following Consent Agenda:

- ► Approval of the 2012 outdoor warning siren maintenance agreement in the amount of \$20,390.40 with Blue Valley Public Safety;

WESTAR 01-11-12

Chad Luce, Westar Energy, made a presentation to the Board on their tree trimming program which will eliminate trees growing up in the power lines. The program will be on a five-year cycle. The focus "right tree in the right place" should decrease power outages by up to 60% after the five-year cycle.

CITY OF LAWRENCE 01-11-12

Gaughan moved to direct the County Administrator to send a letter to the City of Lawrence requesting the City pay a portion of the update of the Emergency Communications Center. Motion was seconded by Thellman and carried 3-0.

At 4:25 p.m., Flory moved for the Board to recess to executive session for 45 minutes (until 5:10 p.m.) for the purpose of consultation with the County Counselor on a matter which would be deemed privileged under the attorney-client relationship. The justification is to maintain attorney client privilege on a matter involving Douglas County. Attendees included Evan Ice, County Counselor; Craig Weinaug, County Administrator; and Sarah Plinsky, Assistant County Administrator. Motion was seconded by Thellman and carried 3-0.

The Board returned to regular session at 5:10 p.m. No action was taken.

RECESS 01-11-12

At 5:10 p.m., Thellman moved for the board to recess until 6:35 p.m. Motion was seconded by Flory and carried3-0.

At 6:35 p.m. the Board returned to regular session.

PUBLIC HEARING ON DISTRICT MAP 01-11-12

Gaughan moved to open a public hearing to discuss revisions to the County Commission district map based on 2010 census data.

The Board reviewed three options as follows:

• First alternative equalizes the population between districts by shifting two precincts from District 3 to District 1. Under this proposal, all of the District 1 remains within Lawrence and the other two districts represent portions of Lawrence, and portions of the remainder of the County.

- The second alternative makes more specific changes to the boundaries, and equalizes the populations of each of the districts slightly better. Under this proposal, District 1 continues to be contained completely within the city limits of Lawrence, and the other two districts continue to represent portions of Lawrence, and portions of the remainder of Lawrence:
- The third alternative represents a more significant shift in how the boundaries are drawn. Under this alternative, each of the districts would include a significant portion of Lawrence, one of the three other cities in the county, and a portion of the unincorporated area. District 1 would include a portion of Lawrence, all of Lecompton, and a portion of the unincorporated area located primarily northwest of Lawrence. District 2 would include a portion of Lawrence, all of Eudora, and a portion of the unincorporated area located primarily northeast of Lawrence. District 3 would include a portion of Lawrence, all of Baldwin City, and a portion of the unincorporated area located primarily south of Lawrence.

Jamie Shew, County Clerk, described how redistricting will affect notification for elections. Notification will be sent out to voters after all redistricting is completed as other things may also affect the districts.

It was a consensus by the Commission to eliminate Option 3 because of the many changes it would require.

Gaughan stated he prefers Option 2 for its compactness, population equity and keeping our neighborhoods, our communities of interest intact.

Flory prefers Option 1 because it minimized disruption among the voters. He said some will lose their vote in 2012 because the seat they vote for will change and not be open.

Thellman stated she also prefers Option 2 because it is more equal in population than the other options.

Gaughan moved to close the public hearing. There was no comment from the public.

Gaughan moved to direct staff to draw up documents for Option 2. Motion was seconded by Thellman and carried 2-1 with Flory in opposition.

Flory stated the greatest risk for many of the people comes not from the property on the CUP but the adjoining property to the west. He asked if there is any way we can encourage or demand the landowner take action to protect the area from potential flooding problems.

Keith Browning, Director of Public Works, stated he doesn't think the County can demand anything. However, staff can contact the owner to see if she is interested in helping to start a woody buffer along that river.

Gaughan stated the way he understands the memo, the threat is there under any conditions. The quarry might exacerbate issue.

There was discussion on what projects the Public Works department plans to complete this year and the possibility of postponing several projects to a future date due to the economic situation. This postponement could lead to a \$1 million in reallocation of funds to be put towards the 2013 budget.

After further discussion, Flory moved to approve the CIP as is with a \$4 million budget, leaving the \$1 million in funding to be discussed during budget sessions. Motion was seconded by Thellman and carried 3-0.

WORK SESSION ON 2013 BUDGET 02-08-12

Craig Weinaug, County Administrator, opened discussions with the Board concerning preliminary projections for the 2013 Budget. Weinaug is anticipating budget challenges due to a loss in revenue brought on by a continued decline in property values.

Debbie Sparkes, Budget Director, made a presentation to the Board on her projections of a 2.164 mill levy increase based upon projected increases in costs and projected decreases in revenue.

The purpose for the presentation was to make the Commission aware of the projected gap between revenues and expenses at the same service levels. The next step would be to schedule a work session to discuss alternative solutions to close the projected gap. The Board suggested having department heads make requests early on instead of waiting for budget discussion. Weinaug stated department heads and employees are continually looking for ways to push costs down. There was discussion on exploring what mill levy increase would help meet budgetary needs without raising taxes.

No action was taken.

Flory moved to approve accounts payable in the amounts of \$2,779,684.27 to be paid on 02/09/12 and \$351,277.01 paid on 01/26/12. Motion was seconded by Gaughan and carried 3-0.

- 1. It is the intent of the Douglas County Public Works Department to purchase 350 gallons of Picloram 22K, 400 gallons of 2,4D Hardball, 600 gallons Glyphosate, 400 gallons of PastureGard HL, 50 gallons of Milestone, 24 quarts of Milestone, and 128 ounces of Escort.
- 2. Bids must be submitted on forms provided by the Douglas County Public Works Department, 1242
 Massachusetts Street, Lawrence, Kansas or by Demand Star at www.demandstar.com. Specifications
 and bid requirements are included in these documents. This document must be left intact and will be the
 only form accepted as a bid by the Board of County Commissioners.
- 3. Bidders shall submit sample labels and material safety data sheets of all pesticides bids.
- 4. Bidders shall show net price per gallon on each container size, and formulations. The total price for the county shall be F.O.B. our warehouse, Lawrence, Kansas. The county is not subject to Federal, State or City taxes.
- 5. The herbicide specified <u>must</u> be approved by the Kansas State Board of Agriculture, for cost share, for the current year.
- 6. Bids shall be submitted as follows:
 - a. One or more deliveries of 350 gallons Picloram 22 K (1 gallon containers)
 - b. One or more deliveries of 400 gallons 2, 4-D Hardball (1 gallon containers)
 - c. One or more deliveries of 600 gallons Glyphosate (2 ½ gallon containers)
 - d. One or more deliveries of 400 gallons PastureGard HL (1 gallon containers)
 - e. One or more deliveries of 50 gallons Milestone (2 ½ gallon containers)
 - f. One or more deliveries of 24 quarts Milestone (quarts)

- 7. <u>Each herbicide shipment will be delivered no later than fourteen (14) working days after notification from the Public Works Department.</u>
- 8. Prices for purchase of additional amounts of herbicides will be guaranteed for the remainder of calendar year 2012.

Bids shall be delivered to the Office of the Douglas County Clerk before the time and date specified in the Notice to Bidders. Any bids received after the time specified will be returned unopened.

- 11. A sample of each lot and formulation may, at the discretion of the Director of Public Works, be checked by the Kansas Department of Agriculture, Control Division, before the herbicides are paid for.

- 1. SCOPE: The following terms and conditions shall prevail unless otherwise modified by Douglas County within this bid document. Douglas County reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids received.
- 2. DEFINITIONS AS USED HEREIN:
 - a. The term "bid request" means a solicitation of a formal sealed bid.
 - b. The term "bid" means the price offered by the bidder.
 - c. The term "bidder" means the offer or vendor.
 - d. The term "County" means Douglas County, Kansas.
 - e. The term "Board of County Commissioners or "BOCC" means the governing body of Douglas County, Kansas.
- 3. COMPLETING BID: Bids must be submitted only on the forms (or reproductions thereof) provided in this document. All information must be legible. Any and all corrections and/or erasures must be initialed. Each bid sheet must be signed by the authorized bidder and required information must be provided.
- 4. CONFIDENTIALITY OF BID INFORMATION: Each bid must be sealed and submitted in an envelope clearly marked "HERBICIDES" to provide confidentiality of the bid information prior to the bid opening. Supporting documents and/or descriptive literature may be submitted with the bid. Do not indicate bid prices on literature.
 - All bids and supporting bid documents become public information after the bid opening and are available for public inspection by the general public in accordance with the Kansas Open Records Act.
- ACCURACY OF BID: Each bid is publicly opened in the presence of the Douglas County Clerk. It is necessary that any and all information presented is accurate and/or will be that by which the bidder will complete the contract. 8. LATE BIDS, CHANGES OR WITHDRAWALS: Bids received after the deadline designated in this bid document shall not be considered and shall be returned unopened.

Bids may be changed or withdrawn prior to the bid opening. All such transaction must be submitted in writing and received by the County Clerk's Office prior to the bid deadline. Changes or withdrawals may be made after the bid deadline only with the approval of the Board of County Commissioners. After bid opening, no changes in bid prices or other provisions of bids prejudicial to the interest of the County of fair competition shall be permitted.

- 9. BIDS BINDING: All bids submitted shall be binding upon the bidder if accepted by the County within fifteen (15) calendar days after the bid opening.
- 10. EQUIVALENT BIDS: When brand or trade names are used in the bid invitation, it is for the purpose of item identification and to establish standards for quality, style and features. Bids on equivalent items of substantially the same quality, style and features are invited unless items are marked "No Substitute." Equivalent bids must be accompanied by descriptive literature and/or specifications to receive consideration. - 11. All equipment shall be assembled, and ready for operation when delivered.
- 12. WARRANTY: Supplies or services furnished as a result of this bid shall be covered by the most favorable commercial warranties, expressed or implied, that the bidder and/or manufacturer gives to any customer. The rights and remedies provided herein are in addition to and do not limit any rights afforded to the County by any other clause of this bid. Dear Dr. Yoder:

Thank you for your letter to Secretary Deb Miller received on November 23, 2011, concerning the installation of flashing lights and gates at the BNSF Railway Company crossing of East 950 Road in Douglas County. I apologize for the delay in our response. We appreciate your concern for safety at this at-grade railroad crossing.

The options that are available to the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) to help address the safety concerns of this crossing are as follows:

Option #1: Signalize crossing using Federal Section 130 funds

KDOT administers federal funds under the United States Code of Federal Regulations (23CFR130) for the elimination of hazards at railway-highway crossings. This program requires that we maintain a database of public at-grade crossings and prioritize crossings for scheduling projects based on both train and vehicular traffic at the crossing. This ensures that we address the highest prioritized crossings first. Our database shows the Average Annual Daily Traffic (AADT) for East 950 Road to be 39, and the trains-per-day on this track to be five. The resulting priority for this crossing is not high enough for signalization using Section 130 funds in the near future.

Option # 2: Use a corridor approach to improve safety in a localized area

Corridor projects involve using federal funds to signalize a crossing in the same general area of a crossing that is eliminated by the local government closing or rerouting a roadway. Along with the benefit of getting a signalized crossing, the operating railroad may also offer an incentive for crossing closure or consolidation.

Option #3: Use state funds to signalize a crossing

There is a small set-aside of state funds available for addressing safety concerns on crossings not eligible for federal funds. The scope of most such projects is the installation of flashing light warning systems with gates, but these funds may also be used to consolidate crossings or to incentivize closure of crossings. These projects require a 20 percent participation by the operating railroad. To initiate a state-funded project, the Douglas County Commission would need to submit a resolution to KDOT requesting that the crossing be looked at for safety improvements. An example resolution is enclosed for your information.

It appears Options 2 & 3 could provide a mechanism to address your concern. Either option would require action/participation by Douglas County. KDOT is certainly willing to participate in and/or provide any additional information for a further discussion between USD 343 and Douglas County.

RE: Review of 2012 Heritage Grant Documents

The Heritage Conservation Council (HCC) is proposing that the 2012 Heritage Grant Program be structured as it was in 2011. The grant application questions remain unchanged from the 2011 grant cycle. There are also no changes to the grant project agreement, the interim report, and the final report for the 2012 heritage grant cycle.

The HCC requests the Board of County Commissioners to review the following documents related to the 2012 Heritage Grant Program. They include:

- 2012 Heritage Grant Timetable
- 2012 Heritage Grant Guideline
- 2012 Heritage Grant Application
- 2012 Heritage Grant Project Agreement
- 2012 Heritage Grant Interim Project Report
- 2012 Heritage Grant Final Project Report

Funding Allocation

The Douglas County Commission allocated \$350,000 in the 2012 County budget to assist with the development and creation of natural and cultural heritage conservation projects. As recommended in the Heritage Conservation Task Force Final Report (2010), the 2012 Heritage Grant Program once again is structured to consist of Major grants (55% of funding allocation; \$192,500) and Target grants (30% of funding allocation; \$105,000). A Major grant proposal is defined as a proposal requesting at least \$105,000. Target grant proposals may request at most \$104,999.

Grant Timetable

The 2012 Heritage Grant Program application period is planned to extend from February 20, 2012 to April 20, 2012. A Heritage Grant Workshop hosted by the HCC is slated for March 13, 2012. Review of applications by the HCC begins in late April¹ and concludes on May 24, 2012. The Council's recommendation will be forwarded to the Board of County Commissioners on May 30, 2012.

Changes to the 2012 Heritage Grant Program include:

- 1. Creation of the 2012 Heritage Grant Guideline to assist grant applicants in submitting a grant application.
- 2. **All** applicants—those submitting either a target grant application or a major grant application—will be asked to make a presentation to the HCC as part of the evaluation process.
- 3. The 2011 grant program consisted of two applications—one for the major grant projects and one for target grant projects. To streamline the application procedure, one grant application has

been created. Within the grant application, the applicant is able to select whether the application is a Major grant project or a Target grant project.

4. A hard copy submission will be required from all 2012 grant applicants. The application will be available in PDF and Word formats. The 2011 grant cycle enabled both hard copy and electronic copy submission.

FY 2012 Douglas County Natural & Cultural Heritage Grant Program Guidelines

I. OVERVIEW

Purpose

The Douglas County Commission authorized \$350,000in the 2012 County budget to assist with the development and creation of natural and cultural heritage conservation projects. Following the recommendations outlined in *The Natural & Cultural Heritage Task Force Final Report*¹, the Heritage Conservation Council (HCC) allocated funding for 2012 heritage priorities as follows:

Funding Priorities	Allocation Percentage
Major Grant Project(s)	55%
Target Grant Projects	30%
Douglas County Inventory of Natural & Cultural Resources	10%
Administration	5%
Total	100%

Major Grants

One or two major grant projects can receive up to 55% of the total allocated funds. A major grant proposal is defined as a proposal requesting at least \$105,000. Grant projects falling in this category should be large enough to have a major impact on the conservation of our natural and cultural resources. These grants are competitive and not every proposal will be funded.

Target Grants

A series of target grant projects can receive up to 30% of allocated funds. Target grant proposals are equally important for conserving Douglas County natural and cultural heritage and may request at most \$104,999. These grants are competitive and not every proposal will be funded.

Grant Period

FY2012 grants should be completed within a 24 month period from the project start date.

Grant Timeframe

Application Deadline April 20, 2012

Applicant Presentations Week of April 30 & May 7, 2012

HCC Evaluation May 17 & May 24, 2012

HCC Recommendation on Board of County Commissioners' Agenda May 30, 2012

II. ELIGIBILITY

Who Can Apply

Individuals, nonprofit organizations, universities, K-12 schools, businesses and any unit of local government.

Individuals or organizations with an open or completed 2011 Douglas County natural and cultural heritage grant may apply for 2012 grant funds.

Individuals or organizations may apply for multiple grants to support separate projects.

Project Geographic Location

Grant projects must occur in Douglas County, Kansas.

Project Categories

To be eligible for funding, projects must fall into at least one of the following categories:

- 1. Historic Structures
- 2. Prairie; woodlands, waterways; habitat restoration/preservation
- 3. Agriculture (working farms, heritage farms; high quality agricultural soils)
- 4. Freedom's Frontier themes (Civil War & pre-Civil War heritage; Settlement stories; Enduring struggle for freedom)
- 5. Pre-settlement history

III. APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Grant application forms are available at http://www.douglas-county.com/depts/ad/hcc/ad_hcc.aspx or may be obtained by contacting the HCC Coordinator.

Complete <u>all</u> questions contained in the grant application and submit **one original signed application**, **one set of original support materials (if applicable)**, and seven additional copies of all materials to the Douglas County Heritage Conservation Council, Douglas County Courthouse, 1100 Massachusetts Street, Lawrence, KS 66046. The Courthouse is open Monday-Friday 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. Applications which are mailed to the above address must be postmarked by **April 20, 2012**. Hand delivered applications must be received by 5:00 p.m., **April 20, 2012**.

Late applications will not be accepted.

We encourage applicants to submit thorough and concise grant applications.

All grant applications are subject to the Kansas Open Records Act.

IV. APPLICATION EVALUATION & SELECTION

Evaluation Process

Applications will be reviewed for completeness by the Heritage Council Coordinator. After the application deadline closes, the Coordinator will forward complete applications to each member of the HCC for evaluation using the grant evaluation criteria (see below).

Grant applicants submitting a Major grant application and/or Target grant application will be given the opportunity to make a presentation about their proposal to the HCC.

The HCC will meet after the applicant presentations to discuss and recommend grant applications for funding. In the event that the HCC thinks that a change in direction or focus of an application would be beneficial, the Council will discuss and negotiate with the applicant on such a change before making its final grant recommendations.

The HCC will forward its grant award recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners. The Board of County Commissioners will make all final funding decisions.

Competitive Evaluation Criteria

The Natural & Cultural Heritage Task Force Final Report concluded that grant applications should be evaluated according to the impact the proposed project would have on conserving our county's heritage. Therefore, as outlined in the Task Force Final Report, grants are evaluated by the Heritage Conservation Council based on the following criteria:

i) Highest Criteria

The project provides substantial benefit to the conservation of natural and cultural resources.

ii) Remaining Criteria (all of equal importance)

- 1. Overall Quality of Application: Takes into consideration the grant application's completeness, clarity, thoroughness as well as the overall thoughtfulness of the grant project (i.e. is the budget thorough and reflective of the project activities? Did the applicant fully answer each application question?)
- **2. Urgency:** Refers to both the nature and extent of preservation threat.
- **3. Connectivity:** Refers to how strongly the project connects to both physical sites and interpretive stories.
- **4. Community Impact:** Refers to how the project contributes to maintaining or enhancing Douglas County's heritage for public benefit. This may include public educational benefit and/or economic impact.
- **5. Sustainability:** Refers to the long-term maintenance of a project. (i.e. What steps will be taken in the future to ensure the preservation of the project?) This criterion also refers to the environmental, economic and social dimensions of sustainability.
- **6. Educational/Interpretative Value:** Refers to opportunities for the public to acquire educational benefit (i.e. Is there evidence of educational programs, exhibits and/or publications?).
- **7. Matching Resources:** Refers to the presence and extent of additional resources dedicated to the project activities (i.e. in-kind contributions, additional grant funding, volunteer labor).
- **8. Feasibility:** Refers to how realistic the proposed project is. Considerations include the project description, timeframe, and projected costs. (i.e. Is there evidence that the individual or organization has the capacity to accomplish the project?)
- **9. Affordability:** Refers directly to how reasonable the costs associated with grant project activities outlined in the budget appear. (i.e. Do the cost estimates appear valid based on known costs??
- **10. Public Access:** Does the project include opportunity for the public to experience or have contact with the project? If not, is justification provided for not allowing public access?

V. TERMS & CONDITIONS

Awarded grant applicants must sign a project agreement with Douglas County. It is recommended that all potential grant applicants read the project agreement prior to submitting a grant application available at http://www.douglas-county.com/depts/ad/hcc/ad_hcc.aspx. In some instances, conditions specific to the awarding of particular grant may be added to the project agreement. Grants may be partially funded.

All awarded grant applicants shall submit a final report as outlined in the project agreement. Awarded grants in the amount of \$5,000 or more will also submit an interim grant report. These document requirements are available at http://www.douglas-county.com/depts/ad/hcc/ad/hcc.aspx.

An awarded target grant project less than or equal to \$5,000 will receive a check from Douglas County for the entire award amount upon full execution of the project agreement. Target grant projects greater than \$5,000 and Major grant projects will receive initial payment for 30% of the project work upon full execution of the performance agreement. Remaining grant funds will be distributed based upon receipt and approval by the HCC of the interim and final reports (see project agreement for details).

C. COMPETITIVE PROCUREMENT PROCESS

1) Any services and/or materials that are expected to cost \$20,000 or more must seek at least three competitive bids or quotes from qualified individuals/firms. The Grantee must maintain financial records that verify the cost was competitively based from at least three written quotes submitted in response to written specifications. A waiver is permitted if fewer than three qualified individuals/firms are available to perform services and/or provide materials. Although it is not always necessary to select the lowest bid, an explanation for the selection must be documented which should be retained in your files and made available to the county upon request. County staff is available to help the grantee in meeting any procurement issues.

D. **PAYMENT SCHEDULE**

Below are the preferred payment schedules. An alternate payment schedule can be arranged with the HCC Coordinator, if needed.

Grants less than or equal to \$5,000

- 1) Once a grant performance agreement has been fully executed, the Grantee may begin project work. Grantee will receive a check from Douglas County for entire award amount.
- 2) Within 90 days of the completion of the project, the grantee needs to submit the receipt of fiscal documentation and a Final Project Report.

Grants greater than \$5,000

- 1) Once a performance agreement has been fully executed, the County will issue a payment of 30% of the project work.
- 2) When those funds have been expended and the grantee is ready for an additional payment, the Grantee shall submit an interim report that includes financial information related to the initial 30% of project award, as well as plans for the use of the next project award payment. See the guidelines for the interim report available from the HCC.
- 3) Once the interim report is reviewed and approved by the HCC Coordinator, the County will disburse the next 60% of the project award as soon as reasonably possible.
- 4) The remaining 10% of the total grant amount will be distributed as a reimbursement and will be issued once the Final Project Report has been reviewed and approved by the HCC Coordinator. The Final Project Report Template is available from the HCC Coordinator

F. <u>CANCELLATION</u>

The County or the Grantee reserve the right of termination for cause on a thirty (30) day notice should it be determined that either has failed to materially comply with the terms and conditions of the agreement, or when both parties agree that the project will not produce beneficial results commensurate with further expenditure of funds or because of circumstances beyond the control of the County and/or Grantee.

G. MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT

The Grantee agrees to own and maintain the property, and if not the owner, to maintain the property, beginning with the signing of this agreement and ending five years from the completion of the project as indicated by the acceptance of the completion report by the County. Failure to maintain any improvements financed by this grant could provide cause for the county to seek reimbursement of all or part of the grant funds disbursed to the grantee. Exceptions to this requirement may be granted by the county for damages that result from fire, flood, tornado, or other events beyond the control of the grantee.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

1) If a concern or problem occurs during the implementation of the grant project plan, the HCC Coordinator will work with County staff and the grantee to resolve the issue. If the concern persists, it can be brought before the Board of County Commissioners.

- 2) When issuing press releases, official statements or documents that describe the project funded by Douglas County, an acknowledgement of the Douglas County Board of County Commissioners and the Natural Cultural Heritage Program should be included.
- 3) The Grantee agrees that it will comply with and abide by all applicable statutes, including applicable zoning and building code requirements, the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Kansas Conflict of Interest Act, K.S.A. 75-4301 et seq., the Kansas Open Records Act, K.S.A. 45-215 through 45-225, and the Federal Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986. The Grantee also agrees to retain all books, records, and other documents relative to this agreement for five (5) years after final payment,
- 4) The grantee agrees that Douglas County and all of their officers, agents and employees shall not be liable for claims on account of personal bodily injuries or death or on account of property damages arising out of the work to be performed by the grant recipient hereunder and resulting solely from the negligent acts or omissions of the grant recipient, its agents, employees and subcontractors. Such claims may not be pursued in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas Tort Claims Act, K.S.A. 75-6101 et seq.
