Flory moved to authorize the Public Works Director to solicit bids for Project No. 2012-8, surface restoration project on Route 442 from the Wakarusa River Bridge to the K-10 interchange east of Eudora. Motion was seconded by Thellman and carried 3-0.

#### **BIOSCIENCE 03-14-12**

The Board considered approving a letter from the Bioscience and Technology Business Center (BTBC) for a request for the County to commit \$1 million in funding made in installments over a period of 10 years for the Phase II addition to their facility. LaVerne Epp, Executive chairman, and Matt McClorey, President, made the proposal.

Phase I, the life science incubator facility, approved by a prior County Commission is completely full, housing small startup and early stage technology companies. Phase II would allow for an expansion to the facility to accommodate an additional 10-25 new companies.

Flory stated he serves as the County Representative on the BTBC board. This is the most promising economic development going on in Lawrence. A prior commission started this program and we're enjoying the benefits. He is fully supportive of the request for funding.

Craig Weinaug, County Administration, verified that the funding is \$100,000 each year for the next 10 years and funds have been budgeted. The request for Phase II funding was anticipated. The current building, core of building that supports the lab, was built to support an addition. The Phase 1 tenants couldn't support the building. However, this expansion allows the county to eventually get out of subsidizing the building.

Gaughan opened the item for public comment. No comment was received.

Flory moved to move forward with Phase II funding in the amount of \$1million in \$100,000 installment for a period of 10 years with funding coming from the economic development fund and for Staff to take the necessary steps to proceed. Motion was seconded by Thellman and carried 3-0.

#### **SUSTAINABILITY 03-14-12**

The item on the Green Games results was deferred to the March 28, 2012 meeting.

# **GRANT PROPOSAL 03-14-12**

The Board considered the approval for the "Can We Talk" mentoring program to submit a grant application to the Kansas Juvenile Justice Authority. Willie Amison, Program Director, presented the item. If received, the grant would help to expand the mentoring programs in both Lawrence high schools and into all the middle schools targeting students at risk.

There was discussion for the applicant to make sure the organization has the appropriate liability insurance to cover the program as the County would be the grant requester.

Gaughan opened the item for public comment. No comment as received.

Flory moved to approve the grant proposal for an application form to be submitted for Juvenile Delinquency Prevention Trust Fund Grants with submission contingent upon proof of liability insurance with the County listed as an additional insured party. Motion was seconded by Gaughan and carried 3-0.

# Summary: Managed Care -- KanCare and the Community Developmental Disability System:

- 1. The developmental disabilities (DD) waiver already employs a managed care approach (with an administrative cost of less than 3%, which is far less than that which will be allowed for the administration of the managed care contracts).
  - Capitated rates are used, within which all services are provided.
  - Annual utilization reviews and needs assessments are conducted based on needs, not consumer or family "wants".
  - Standardized and state supervised eligibility determination assure that no person receives services unless eligible.
  - Community Service Providers assume the full cost for the services using already established rates, and assume full liability for all services provided in the community.
- 2. There are no significant savings that can be captured because the Kansas DD system already underwent so-called managed care reform in the early 1990s:
  - Kansas adopted reforms in the early 90s, codified in the DD Reform Act.
  - Kansas has closed all but 300 of the up-to 3000 long-term care institutional beds that was once the statewide DD program.
  - The savings in that time has already totaled many hundreds of millions.

The State must continue its role as a partner in the developmental disability service system. Dating back to its earliest days, the State has assumed direct responsibility for providing a structure of support for persons with developmental disabilities. As the State refined how support would be provided, it transitioned from the brick and mortar of state-run institutions to a partnership with communities in providing supports across the state. Assignment of long-term care services for Kansans with developmental disabilities to the proposed managed care model pushes that responsibility onto a private corporate entity, and ends decades and decades of the State's acknowledgement of direct responsibility in management of supports to these individuals.

The DD service system, by statute, has a clearly defined administrative structure. This structure, embodied by the gatekeeping role of the CDDO, is defined in statute as a partnership between communities and the State. Will the transition of DD long-term care services to a private sector managed care model require change to existing Kansas statute?

Because of this defined partnership between communities and the State of Kansas, Kansas counties contribute millions of dollars of local tax support to the DD service system. Has consideration been given to how the transition to managed care by a private, corporate entity may impact the local tax support currently provided to the DD service system?

Assurances have been given concerning the new managed care system that:

- 1. CDDOs will continue to serve as gatekeepers and determine which tier a consumer is in,
- 2. That consumers will continue to use their current case manager, and
- 3. That the same service providers will continue to be used.

If those factors remain as currently exists, how does the change to a private managed care system for long-term care of the DD population gain greater savings? Our concern, as noted by the Henry Kaiser Family Foundation in February 2012, "Fee for Service payment rates, on which capitation rates may be based, are already so low in many states that there is no "room" to extract cost savings by reducing price, leaving utilization as the remaining source of potential savings."

# **RESOLUTION 12-\_\_\_**

A RESOLUTION BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DOUGLAS COUNTY, KANSAS, ENCOURAGING THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF KANSAS TO CAREFULLY CONSIDER ANY CHANGE IN THE MEDICAID OR HEALTH CARE PROVISIONS FOR PERSONS WITH INTELLECTUAL AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES, TO REMOVE LONG-TERM CARE SERVICES FOR SAID PERSONS FROM THE PROPOSED PRIVATIZED MANAGED CARE PLAN, AND TO CONTINUE PRESENT STATE/COUNTY-APPOINTED CDDO ADMINISTRATION OF THIS SERVICE DELIVERY SYSTEM.

**WHEREAS,** Article 7 of the Kansas Constitution establishes that the state shall care for and support persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities, and;

WHEREAS, the Developmental Disability Reform Act of 1995 and Article 64 of the Kansas Administrative Regulations establishes that services for persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities shall be provided by means of a system of contracts between the State of Kansas and county-appointed Community Developmental Disability Organizations (CDDOs), who in turn contracts with private service providers, and;

**WHEREAS,** the current public-private contracting structure provides an efficient, effective, and privatized Medicaid waiver for home and community based service delivery with less than 3% administrative payment to CDDOs, and;

**WHEREAS,** the State of Kansas plans to transform Medicaid through additional privatization by adding another system of contracting with three managed care vendors, and;

**WHEREAS,** the proposed privatization with three managed care vendors calls into question which administrative entity and appeal structure is ultimately responsible for long-term care services and supports for persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities, and;

**WHEREAS,** the life-long need for long-term services and supports for persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities is not reduced by providing enhanced medical and behavioral healthcare coordination, health homes, and preventative healthcare, and;

**WHEREAS,** persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities can benefit from plans to provide enhanced medical/behavioral healthcare coordination, health homes, and preventative healthcare to improve health outcomes, and;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DOUGLAS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, OF DOUGLAS COUNTY, KANSAS THAT;

The Commissioners hereby urge the Governor's administration to:

1. Remove the system of long-term care for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities from the January 2013 implementation of Medicaid managed care, and;

- 2. Maintain the current state/community developmental disability contracting, administration, dispute resolution, and appeal system, and;
- 3. Include intellectual and developmental disabilities in proposed Medicaid managed care plans for integrated medical/behavioral healthcare coordination, health homes, and preventative healthcare to improve health outcomes, and;
- 4. Reconsider how proposed savings on long-term care for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities can be achieved with Medicaid managed care without reducing benefit levels, provider reimbursement, or eligibility, and;
- 5. Protect vulnerable Kansans by thorough and open vetting of potential managed care vendors for history of Medicaid fraud/abuse of public funds, customer satisfaction/ timely reimbursement for services delivered, and historical performance of improved health and financial savings outcomes.
- 6. This resolution shall take effect and be in force on and after its adoption.

Precast concrete drainage structure

During the March 7, 2012 meeting the BOCC authorized me (by consent agenda approval) to approve the low price quote from Cretex Concrete Products for supply of a 23'-span precast, 3-sided concrete drainage structure in the amount of \$70,670.00 for the replacement of Structure No. 11.00N-12.40E. Following BOCC purchase approval, we discovered the Cretex structure did not meet specifications. The structure originally quoted by Cretex had 8'-long sides, while we specified 10'-long sides.

We contacted Cretex and notified them of the discrepancy. They submitted a revised price quote of \$73,840.00, as shown below.

SUBJECT: 2011 Year End Transfers

DATE: March 26, 2012

Each year, as a part of the Year End process, Administration considers transfers to equipment reserve of unspent budgeted funds and unanticipated revenues. In 2011, sales tax revenues were higher than expected and departments under spent their budgets. Some of the equipment reserve transfers are to finance projects not completed in the prior fiscal year, and some transfers are to support future capital or equipment related projects. This year, Staff recommends additional transfers for a potential new Public Works facility and for capital repairs associated with the Baldwin Ambulance Station.

The amount allocated for the Heritage Conservation in 2011 has been transferred to the Equipment Reserve Fund identified as Heritage Conservation \$350,000. These funds will be used to finance projects already approved by the Board of County Commissioners and will off-set some expenses that have already occurred for these projects in the Equipment Reserve fund.

The amount allocated for Economic Development Initiatives along with what was committed for the Berry Plastics project has been transferred to the Equipment Reserve Fund also, identified as Economic Development Initiatives \$344,248.

Attached is the final year end transfer for 2011.

The table below shows the actual year end fund balance (12/31/2011) after the transfer compared to the budgeted balance.

The budgeted year end fund balance is what we started the 2012 budget with.
