Official Instructions

To vote for a person, darken the box to the left of the person's name.
To vote for the pair of candidates, darken the box to the left of the names of the candidates for governor and lieutenant governor.
To vote for a person whose name is not printed on the ballot, write the person's name in the blank space and darken the box to the left.
Notice: If you tear, deface, or make a mistake and wrongfully mark any ballot, you must return it to the election board and receive a new ballot or ballots.

Douglas County
Proposition One
Vote Yes or No**

Shall the following be adopted?

Shall Douglas County, Kansas (the
"County"), be authorized to: (1)
impose a one-quarter percent
(0.25%) countywide retailers' sales
tax (the "Sales Tax") for the purpose
of financing the costs of providing
mental health services for the
County, collection of such Sales Tax
to commence on April 1, 2019, or as
soon thereafter as permitted by law;
and (2) issue sales tax/general
obligation bonds of the County in an
amount not to exceed \$12,235,000
(the "Bonds") to finance all or a
portion of the capital costs to
construct, furnish and equip new
mental health facilities for the
County, related interest costs during
construction and issuance costs;
provided that the County receive,
prior to the issuance of the Bonds, a
comprehensive feasibility study that
indicates the revenues received
from the Sales Tax will be sufficient
to retire the Bonds without the
necessity of levying any ad valorem
taxation; all pursuant to the authority
of K.S.A. 12-187 et seq., as
amended?
